Season	Description	Temp. Range
Winter (June to August)	Cooler and dry	-7°C to 32°C
The temperature can drop below 0°C overnight in winter. Please ensure you are equipped for these extremes. Humidity Range 20% – 50%	Fine weather with minimal rain is the norm with the possibility of getting quite cold by Territory standards between the June to July period. Spring (Sept-Nov) and Autumn (Mar-May) in Central Australia see warm days and cool evenings.	
Summer (December to February)	Hot and dry	16°C to 45°C
The temperature can rise above 40°C in summer. Please ensure you are equipped for these extremes. Humidity Range 30% – 95%	Central Australia has a semi-arid climate. In the summer months, the days are generally hot, sometimes very hot. If rain is to fall, it is more likely in the summer months, which may lead to road closures.

Road	Access is by road, 320km Northeast of Alice Springs via the Plenty and Sandover Highways. The road is sealed for 100km followed by 220km of unsealed road. The trip takes approximately four hours from Alice Springs in dry conditions. A 4WD vehicle is required to make the journey after rain. Heavy rain will close the road.		
Air	Ampilatwatja can be accessed by air. The unsealed air strip is located 500m from the Community. There are no regular passenger flights to the community and the airstrip closes with heavy rains.
